





Chelmsford & Mid-Essex RECOMMENDED PUB GUIDE







Welcome to the Chelmsford & Mid -Essex CAMRA branch area which includes the towns of Braintree and Witham as well as villages around the city of Chelmsford.



This guide highlights fantastic pubs in our branch area which have been selected for the quality of their real ale, features and attractiveness. Details of the CAMRA Criteria for judging pubs are on Page 21.

All are surveyed and updated by local CAMRA members on whatpub.com throughout the year. To establish the quality of the beer available throughout the year please score the beers you drink at the pubs using the National Beer Scoring System on whatpub.com or the GBG app. Scores can also be handed in at Branch or Committee meetings. You may include half scores and add in the name of your beer if it is not listed on the drop down menu. See page 20/21 at the back of this guide. We use these scores to aid in the selection of pubs for the Good Beer Guide and our Recommended Pub Guide.





In CAMRA National Inventory of Historic Pub Interiors this Victorian brickbuilt pub overlooks the village green. The front door opens directly into what was once the bottle and jug but with the passing of time it now serves as a small snug. To the left is the wood-panelled public bar, little changed since it was built in 1888. To the right is a saloon bar originally converted from the landlord's front parlour and further extended in the 1980s. The half-cellar is accessed from behind the bar with Cask Marque quality beers being served on gravity. Outside, seating in front of the pub with a children's play area and a large family garden to the side and rear. An outside Gents, which is still in use, adds to the pub's authenticity. No meals available. Primarily a conversation pub, with traditional pub games and an antique piano.


